

HAND-HOLDING OF A GOVERNMENT SCHOOL

The project was initiated as a step towards social responsibility wherein college aimed at helping the government school in various ways. The IQAC team of college visited Baba Ramdev Sarvodya Kanya Vidyalaya, Prasad Nagar in January 2016, to meet the Principal of college and identify the areas wherein Kalindi college can provide an assistance. The Principal of school, Ms. Ranju Ailawadi informed the team that their class XII students were facing a lot of difficulty in the Accountancy subject as their regular teacher was on leave. The students have scored very low marks in their pre-board exams and majority of them failed in the subject. The school had an immediate need of someone who could facilitate the preparation of class XII students for their board exams.

Five students from commerce department in final year (Apoorva, Shubhanjali, Mehak, Aashima, and Naina) visited the school and interacted with the students. The students from school were enthusiastic about learning and informed our volunteers about the various topics in which they were facing difficulties. On the basis of the inputs received from school students, a structure for remedial classes was prepared by the volunteers.

The volunteers spiritedly took special remedial classes for Class XII students in the Baba Ramdev Sarvodya Kanya Vidyalaya to facilitate their preparation of accounts for upcoming board exams. The classes were taken for about one and half months. B.Com final year students went to the school almost daily during that time period and took up XII class students' queries in accounts.

The school Principal appreciated the efforts of our students and informed that in board exams the pass percentage in Accounts rose from about 26% in pre boards to approximately 90% in board exams.

In addition to this the student volunteers got an exposure to the teaching world and learnt a lot in the entire process.
